Swimming Pools: What you need to know

- Swimming pools, spas and hot tubs need to be installed in accordance with the manufacturer's specification with a
 temporary barrier installed during installation or construction and needs to be in place until a permanent barrier
 is installed.
- Temporary and permanent barriers need to be at least 48 inches above grade and no more than 72 inches above grade, built of rigid construction, with a self-closing and self-locking gate that is lockable when unattended.
- All gates need to open outward, away from the pool, securely lock with a key, combination or other child proof
 lock sufficient to prevent access to the pool through such gate when the swimming pool is not in use or supervised.
- All gates latches must be located within the enclosure and must be located at least 40 inches above grade.
- All gate latch handles less than 54 inches from the bottom of the gate must be located at least 3 inches below the top of the gate and neither the gate, nor the barrier, can have any openings greater than ½ inch within 18 inches of the latch handle.
- Spas and hot tubs do not need a permanent barrier provided it has an approved safety cover installed.
- All above-ground swimming pools less than 48 inches tall and in-ground swimming pools need to have a
 permanent barrier installed.
- All above-ground swimming pools 48 inches or taller with an approved safety ladder or approved safety measure attached to it's surrounding deck or platform do not need a permanent barrier installed.
- Where an above-ground pool structure is used as a barrier or where the barrier is mounted on top of the pool structure and the means of access is a ladder or steps, the ladder or steps must be secured, locked or removed to prevent access or be surrounded by an approved permanent barrier.
- The location of all swimming pools must be at least 10% of the lot width, but never less than 5 feet, away from all side and rear lot lines.
- Pool location must be at least 15 feet away from any structure with a foundation, 20 feet from any active well, septic tank, leach bed, etc. and at least 10 feet from any overhead electrical service lines.
- All electrical works needs to be inspected by an independent third party agency, approved by the Town of Gates, as to conform to the New York State Electrical Code.
- An acceptable pool alarm device, capable of detecting a child entering the water and giving an audible alarm must be installed, used and maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications.
- The pool alarm device must be audible at poolside, as well as inside the house where the pool is located.
- The pool alarm device cannot be located on a person or be dependent on devices located on a person for its
 operation.
- Where applicable, multiple pool alarm devices may be required to provide detection capabilities at every point on the surface of the swimming pool.
